Councilman Scott Burton, Councilman Larry Gann, Councilman Charles Lyons, Councilman Jerry Shattuck and Councilman Clay Wright were present for the meeting. Councilman Jim McBride was absent.

Councilman Clay Wright made the motion to approve the agenda and was seconded by Councilman Jerry Shattuck. The motion was moved to carry.

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

A. FIRST READING OF NEW ORDINANCE

Ordinance # 565 – An Ordinance of the City of Clinton, Tennessee Amending the Municipal Offenses Ordinance Regulating the Offenses against the Peace and Quiet Steve Jones explained that the amendment to the

ordinance is to add another exemption. Councilman Jerry Shattuck made the motion to approve Ordinance # 565 on first reading and was seconded by Councilman Clay Wright. Councilman Clay Wright made the motion to amend the motion to include “Anderson County sanctioned events, Clinch River Antiques Festival and Anderson County Fair” and was seconded by Councilman Scott Burton. Janice Holman of 229 Vintage Lane expressed her concerns that band practice is an ongoing activity rather than an event and that no organization should be exempt but rather broaden the limits to the ordinance. David Worthington, Ann Broome expressed their support for the ordinance. Ordinance # 565 was approved as amended unanimously.

VISITORS –

Darrell Thomas and Todd Brown from Northfolk Southern expressed their concerns regarding the proximity of apartments to the rails and the small children present at the residence. Mr. Thomas presented Council with pictures indicating the only entrance or exit to the apartments are approximately 11 feet from the rails and that on several occasions small children have been present on the tracks. Mr. Thomas suggested to Council that he meet with Curtis Perez and the Police Chief and the owner of the property to see if there’s any resolution to the problem. Mr. Thomas hopes to have some sort of a solution for Council in the August meeting.

The meeting was adjourned the meeting at 5:52 pm.
